Goal: to protect and conserve the natural environments on islands.




Key Topics:

 - Transfer best practices and solutions between islands
 - Host webinars to showcase island case studies and learn from topic experts
 - Design communications/storytelling to island and mainland audiences
 - Network with other islands-oriented networks around the world



- Foster partnership/alignment with other Great Lakes organizations
- Build relationships with mainland decision-makers and thought leaders
- Deliver presentations at conferences and meetings
- Research issues with an island lens and develop policy positions, resolutions, and white papers
- Assist with grant application development, including letters of support



- Identify needs and help implement projects across multiple islands
- Data & Research
 - Support collection/analysis of information and development of metrics specific to islands
 - Facilitate government and academic research on islands
